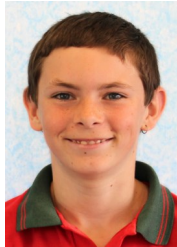
JUNIORS

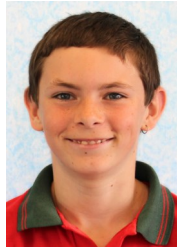

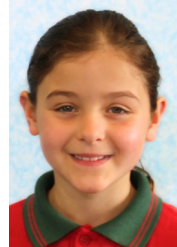


Jake has shown excellent dedication and skill by practicing and mastering an accent displacement pattern on the snare drum.

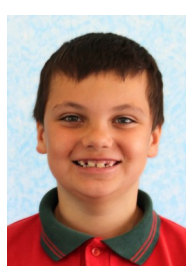
JUNIORS

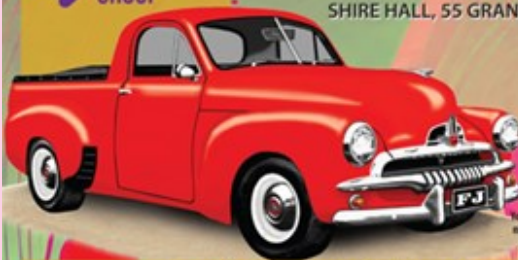
