#### Kindergarten Report

#### Wednesday 22nd February 2023

Home corner and role play (tents outside) have been very popular activities that the children have enjoyed engaging in. Role play is especially beneficial for developing language and communication skills as they communicate with each other in a safe environment.

Drawing and letter formation have also been topics of interest. The children have been setting up little offices, using whiteboards to practise forming letters with staff guidance and support.

Recently we had fun making sausage rolls. The discussions and comments when mixing the mince with our hands were very descriptive and funny.

We have continued to frequent our local pondage park. The children have discovered a bower birds nest and are constantly having road safety rules reinforced on these outings.

Water play continues to be an enjoyable activity especially with this very hot weather we are experiencing. Children develop an understanding of many science concepts such as physics (flow, motion) and mathematics (measurement, equivalence, volume) via their engagement with water play.
