Last week students encountered the Mini-beasts incursion where they really enjoyed getting close to many Australian animals that we don't regularly see. Our teachers also see themselves as learners. This year their professional development is helping to making significant progress in the classroom. Miss Mangelsdorf and Mrs Crowle have been leading an inquiry into the way students use

connectives in their writing, which is leading to students carefully consider they way they join their ideas together and increase the flow of their writing. Yesterday I attended another day of the Teaching Excellence Program to present my inquiry I have been working on in the Juniors class. This term we have been exploring how important it is to use a wider range of mathematical vocabulary to help others understand our thinking. Through these professional learning our teachers are noticing students being increasingly engaged in their learning. Great work to all!
