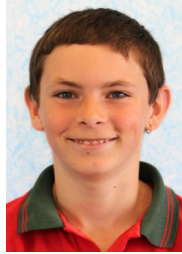


The Grade 4 Free-style Relay team for demonstrating all of the school values by competing valiantly in the Division swimming in Seymour.

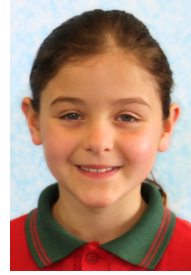


Heath followed the Zumba moves carefully this week. He also created some interesting clapping beats to match the music.

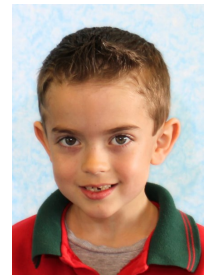


Ellie May worked politely and actively alongside her group. Experimenting, by inserting pencils through a bag filled with water, she was able to consider the idea of flexibility.

Kinder Report: Week 6 Term 1 2025

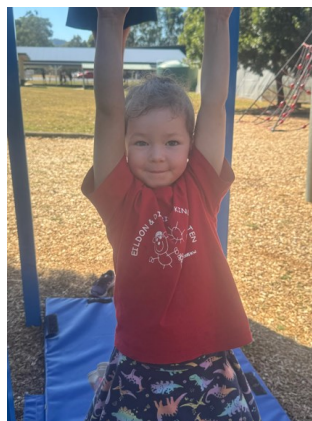
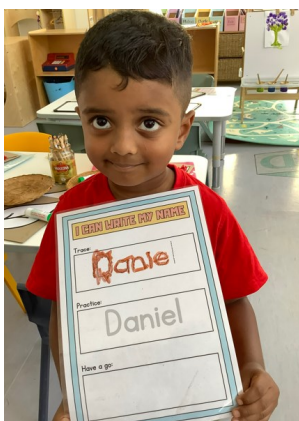


Dear Families,
