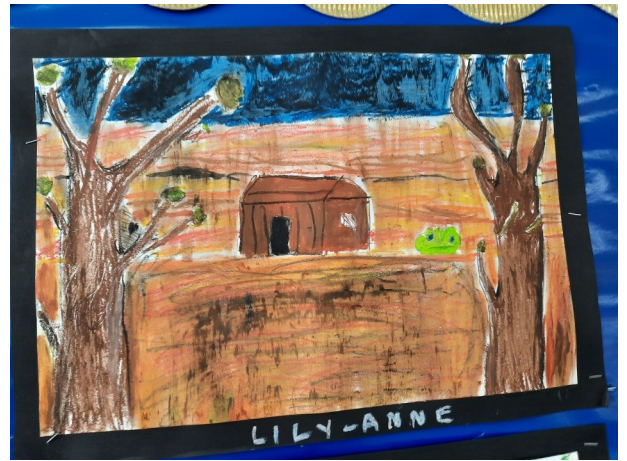

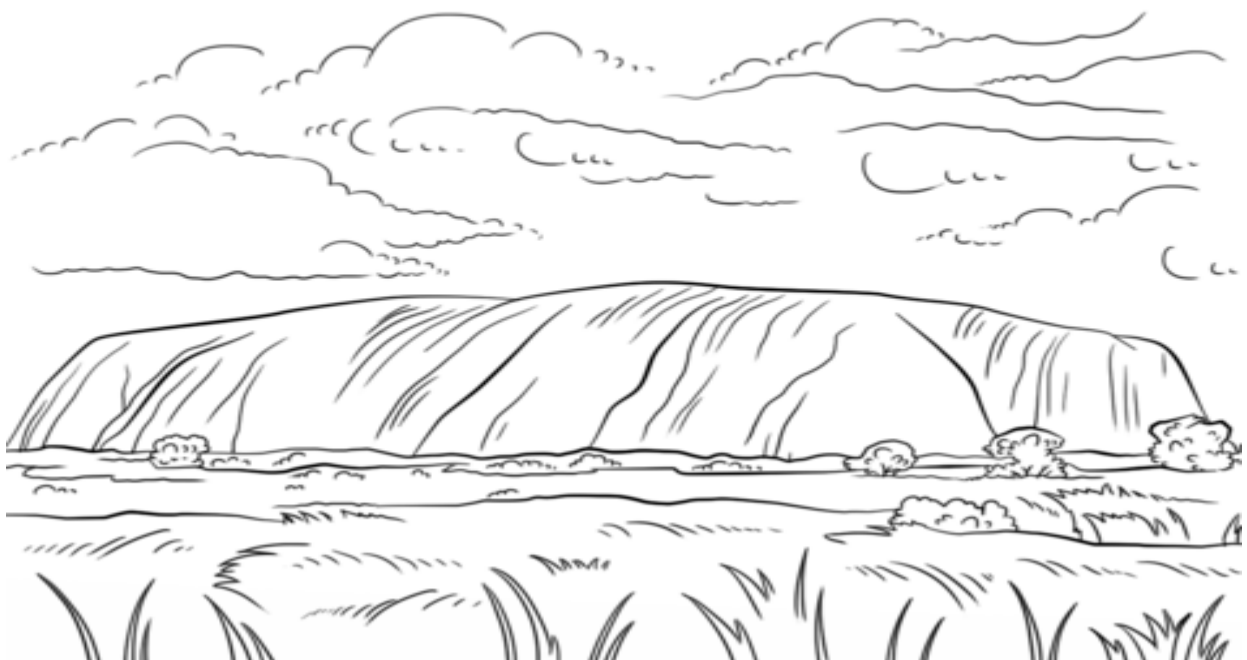
Our students have been busy creating some amazing "Outback: Artwork!"
