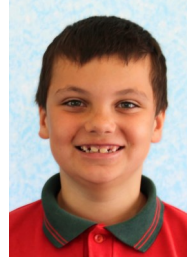

Dear Parents

This week has been a quieter one in the room with a few away, filled with activities that support the children's learning and development

Letter Recognition and Tracing

We have started focusing on recognising the letters of our names. The children have been loving tracing these letters on laminated sheets, which is great for developing their fine motor skills. Tracing helps strengthen hand muscles and improves hand-eye coordination, both of which are essential for writing skills later on.

Exploring Nature: Walks to Town and the Pondage

We've had a few walks this week to explore our local area, including a visit to the Pondage. While there, the children noticed the leaves falling from the trees, which gave us the perfect opportunity to talk about autumn and the changing seasons.

Valentine's Day Crafts

We also celebrated Valentine's Day with some creative crafts. These activities not only allowed the children to express themselves artistically but also encouraged conversations around positive emotions and the importance of caring for others.
