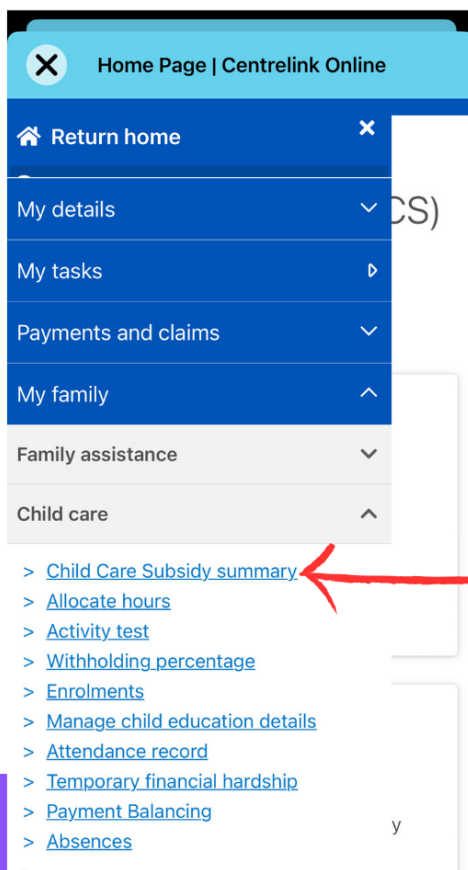
How to find your Child Care Subsidy Entitlement?
