Kinder Report: Week 6 Term 2 2025

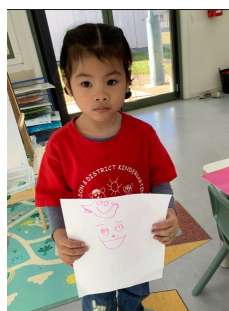
